LINDA WILSON McDUGLE INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANT AWARD
Presented to Classified Employees

In honor of Linda Wilson McDougale, dedicated teacher, principal, Community Relations Director and Associate Superintendent of Guilford County Schools, this award recognizes a classified school employee for his/her dedication to a local unit PTA. Nominees cannot be certified teachers.

He/She should support his/her students through one or more of the following: 1) assisting in the planning, organizing and implementing of instructional programs; 2) providing support for clerical, technical and general classroom functions; 3) communicating the needs of the school and students, assisting students with understanding rules and regulations; 4) conducting self as a positive role model; 5) creating and implementing new, innovative programs for their students.

One (1) winner will be awarded in each category. Nominations are accepted from all levels.

ADMINISTRATOR AWARDS

Presented to Principals or Assistant Principals

Describe the nominee's PTA service for this year, citing specific examples. Entries must not exceed one typewritten page with no reference to school name. You may refer to the nominee by name. The nominee must be a member of the PTA which nominates him/her. Each nominee should uphold the PTA objectives and exemplify support of and involvement in his/her school's PTA program. This award is presented to an Administrator for outstanding service to children and youth through a PTA. Principals and Assistant Principals are eligible. Teachers and staff are not eligible. Submit two (2) identical copies of your entry on standard paper and place a check mark on the checklist indicating you are applying for the Administrator Award.

DR. DORIS HENDERSON OUTSTANDING ELEMENTARY ADMINISTRATOR AWARD

This award is named in honor of Dr. Doris Henderson, Principal of Guilford Primary School and Oak Ridge Elementary School from 1978 until 1997. Dr. Henderson was named the Wachovia Principal of the Year in 1996, received the National School Administrator's Award from the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in 1990 and the National Distinguished Principal Award from the U.S. Office of Education and National Association of Elementary School Principals in 1989.

One (1) award will be presented at the elementary level.

SAMUEL EUGENE BURFORD OUTSTANDING MIDDLE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR AWARD

This award is named in memory of Samuel Eugene Burford, Principal of William Pen High School in High Point from 1933 until its closing in 1968 and Principal of T. Wingate Andrews High School from its opening in 1968 until his retirement in 1971. He became the first black principal of a predominately white senior high school in the state of North Carolina.

One (1) award will be presented at the middle school level.

ROBERT A. CLENDENIN OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR AWARD

This award is named in honor of Robert A. Clendenin, Principal of page High School from 1970 – 1991, Aycock Junior High School from 1967 – 1970, Bessemer Junior High School from 1962 – 1967 and Assistant Principal at Bessemer Junior High from 1960 – 1961.

One (1) award will be presented at the high school level.

EDUCATOR AWARDS

Presented to Certified Teachers

SILAS ABRAHAM PEELER OUTSTANDING ELEMENTARY EDUCATOR AWARD

In memory of Silas Abraham Peeler (1864 – 1948) who served as Principal of Percy and Price Schools, this award is presented to a Certified Teacher for outstanding service to children and youth through an elementary school PTA. Principals and aides are NOT eligible for nomination.

Five (5) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 30 entries must be received for five winners to be chosen. Four awards will be presented for 29-25 entries, three awards will be presented for 24-20 entries and two awards will be given for 19 or fewer than 19 entries.

ANNIE RAY RIFFEY OUTSTANDING MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATOR AWARD

In memory of Annie Ray Riffey, former Principal of Aycock Middle School, this award is presented to a Certified Teacher for outstanding service to children and youth through a middle school PTA. Principals and aides are NOT eligible for nomination.

Three (3) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 14 entries must be received for three winners to be chosen. Two awards will be presented for 13-10 entries and one award will be given for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

EVON DEAN OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATOR AWARD

This award was established in 1979 in honor of Mrs. Evon Dean for her outstanding service to children and youth of Guilford County. This award is presented to a Certified Teacher for outstanding service to children and youth through a high school PTA. Principals and aides are NOT eligible for nomination.

Two (2) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 10 entries must be received for two winners to be chosen. One award will be presented for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

REMEMBER: THIS RELATES ONLY TO PTA SPONSORED ACTIVITIES.

VOLUNTEER AWARDS

Presented to PTA Volunteers

CORINA C. HIPPS OUTSTANDING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PTA VOLUNTEER AWARD

In honor of Corina C. Hipps, this award is presented annually to a PTA member for outstanding service to children and youth through participation in a local elementary school PTA.

Five (5) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 30 entries must be received for five winners to be chosen. Four awards will be presented for 29-25 entries, three awards will be presented for 24-20 entries and two awards will be given for 19 or fewer than 19 entries.

HARRY F. UNDERWOOD OUTSTANDING MIDDLE SCHOOL PTA VOLUNTEER AWARD

This award is in memory of Harry F. Underwood who served as PTA President of Lincoln Junior High. This award is presented annually to a PTA member for outstanding service to children and youth through participation in a local middle school PTA.

Three (3) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 14 entries must be received for three winners to be chosen. Two awards will be presented for 13-10 entries and one award will be given for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

LAURIN WELBORN OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL PTA VOLUNTEER AWARD

This award is named in honor of A. Laurin Welborn for his long and dedicated service on the High Point Board of Education from 1965-1993. This award is presented annually to a PTA member for outstanding service to children and youth through participation in a local high school PTA.

Two (2) winners will be awarded in this category.

Stipulations: A minimum of 10 entries must be received for two winners to be chosen. One award will be presented for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

REMEMBER: THIS RELATES ONLY TO PTA SPONSORED ACTIVITIES.

OUTSTANDING PTA PRESIDENT AWARDS

Presented to PTA Presidents of Local PTA Units

This award is named in Mildred O. Poole.

Describe the nominee's PTA service for this year, citing specific examples. Entries must not exceed one typewritten page with no reference to school name. You may refer to the nominee by name. The nominee(s) must be a member of the PTA which nominates him/her. Each nominee should uphold the PTA Objectives and exemplify support and involvement in his/her school's PTA program. SINGLE PROJECT AWARDS

The purpose of this award is to recognize PTA's for ONE SPECIAL PROJECT sponsored by the PTA during the current school year. The theme should have a service to youth orientation. Judging will be based on the idea, how it has been planned, executed and how many students it impacted. Submit 2 identical copies of your entry on standard paper and place a check mark on the checklist indicating you are applying for the Single Project Award. If your entry is two pages, please put your school ID number on the top of each page and staple page 1 and 2 together on both copies.

Some suggested areas for single projects are:

- A reading enrichment program
- Career or College Planning Program
- A citizenship award program
- A math incentive award program
- A safety, drug awareness, health or anti-violence program
- Any project which enhances the programs, education or youth of the local school

The description of the project you are submitting for this award should be only one typewritten page with no reference to school name and should include the following:

- Title of project and description
- Overall goal
- Overall benefit to your school/students
- Participation of parents, students and teachers (list time invested by participants)
- Number of students benefiting from project

Five (5) elementary winners will be honored.

Stipulations: A minimum of 30 entries must be received for five winners to be chosen. Four awards will be presented for 29-25 entries, three awards will be presented for 24-20 entries and two awards will be given for 19 or fewer than 19 entries.

Three (3) middle school winners will be honored.

Stipulations: A minimum of 14 entries must be received for three winners to be chosen. Two awards will be presented for 13-10 entries and one award will be given for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

Two (2) high school winners will be honored.

Stipulations: A minimum of 10 entries must be received for two winners to be chosen. One award will be presented for 9 or fewer than 9 entries.

Projects which won the Single Project Award the previous school year are not eligible for consideration. Those PTA's who won the previous year may submit an entry, however, it cannot describe the same project repeated and implemented again this school year.

REMEMBER: THIS RELATES ONLY TO PTA SPONSORED ACTIVITIES.

SERVICE TO STUDENTS AWARDS

The highest award presented at the Council level, the Service To Students Award recognizes a local PTA which has done an outstanding job in its total PTA program to benefit their students, parents, staff, administration and community. Submit 2 identical copies of your entry on standard paper and place a check mark on the checklist indicating you are applying for the Service To Students Award. If your entry is two pages, please put your school ID number on the top of each page and staple page 1 and 2 together on both copies.

Scrapbooks or photos are not allowed. Description of the activities you are submitting for this award should include the following:

- Overall purpose of the various activities
- Specific activities and accomplishments
- Specific parent, student, community and staff participation
- Support of the PTA Objectives

Entries should not exceed TWO typewritten pages with no reference to the school name.

One (1) award will be presented at the elementary level.

One (1) award will be presented at the middle school level.

One (1) award will be presented at the high school level.

GCC PTA's Exceptional Children's Individual Award
(Individual)

This award is presented to an individual (parent, volunteer, teacher, student) who is outstanding in their efforts to support and advocate for students with disabilities/differences. Describe the ways in which this person has demonstrated outstanding service to those living with disabilities in the school, PTA, and/or community.

GCC PTA's Exceptional Children's School Award
(School)
